## Class Information

Please contact the shop for enrollment.

**February 2 & 19 Beginning Knitting**—Learn how to cast on, how to knit and purl, how to bind off. Yarn will be supplied. Students should bring a size 7 or 8 set of needles either circular or straight. 2 hour class—\$40

**February 5 Beginning Crochet**—Learn how to make a base chain plus the most frequently used stitches. We'll also learn some basics so you can begin to read patterns. Lefties welcome! Taught by Audrey. 2 hour class—\$40

**February 7 & 21 Bifurcate Cowl Knit Along (KAL)**—Download the pattern at <http://www.classicliteyarns.com/WebLetter/218/KumaraBifurcateCowl.pdf>. Learn Norwegian Cast On, Sewn Bind off, cables, M1 increase, and K2tog decrease. The construction is interesting in that the cowl is knit both flat and in the round. It is worked with two different colors of Worsted/Aran weight yarn. We do not carry Classic Elite Kumara, but we do carry many other suitable yarns such as Laines Du Nord CashSilk, Berroco Comfort, Queensland Kathmandu Aran, Rowan Lima, & Gedifra Riana. The cowl calls for approximately 128 yards each of Color A & Color B. Supplies: Yarn for project, 16" circular needle to obtain correct gauge (most likely a US 7-9), and cable needle. We will do the gauge swatch to determine the correct needle size for the project and learn the Norwegian Cast On in the first session. You can pick your yarn the first session or purchase in advance. \$20 plus cost of materials includes January 17, February 7, and February 21 class dates. Class limit: 8

**February 8 Hip to be Square**—Ever wonder what to do with all that leftover yarn? Want to make something fun and original? The Hip to Be Square class will teach you how to make interesting squares out of leftover yarn and make them into a kimono jacket, afghan, scarf, or anything else that you can think of that's square! In this class we will determine how many squares you need to make your project using your weight of yarn, learn about different squares patterns and learn how to make i-cord for embellishment. 2 hour class—\$40

**February 9 Intermediate Techniques**—Learn how to do increases such kfk, make one and decreases including k2tog, p2tog. We'll also cover the basics of pattern reading, how to find your gauge, and cables. Get the requirement/homework sheet at the shop when you sign up for this class. 2 hours—\$40

**February 10 Socks for Beginners**—Please pick up a requirement sheet at the shop prior to class. 2 hour class—\$40

**February 14 & 28 Toe Up Socks**—Students should know the basics for this class: how to knit and purl! It is helpful (but not required) if the knitter is familiar with knitting in the round, whether on 2 circs or on DPNs, also helpful if acquainted with "Make 1" increases. You will learn to do the Eastern European cast on, a "no bumps" rounded toe, and a short row heel with no heel flap or gussets. There are advantages to toe-up socks! You can try them on as you go to get a perfect fit, no toe grafting necessary plus you never have to worry about running out of yarn and having the foot of your sock be too short! Supplies needed: 50 grams DK weight yarn (i.e. Merino Kind Superfine), two US 2 24" circular needles, 1 yarn needle. 4 hours of class total—\$60

**February 29 Architecture I Part 2**—Tired of your finished sweaters not fitting? Learn how to make your own patterns to fit your measurements. Or, use the skills you'll learn to alter commercial patterns so they fit you perfectly. Must have previously made a sweater with sleeves. Please come to class with yarn picked out to make a sweater and a swatch of the yarn to determine gauge. The first class in this series will be held January 25. 4 hours of class total—\$80
